Online webinar on "Sustainable Agriculture and Food Security after COVID-19

They gave lectures on "Organic Agriculture after COVID-19", "Prospects of Agricultural Development", and "Watersaving Irrigation Technology for Food Security". As you know, today it is time to think about how to make a lot of money in agriculture, not how much you spend, but how much you earn. Agriculture remains the most important sector of Uzbekistan's economy, accounting for 28.2% of GDP. Measures are being taken to meet the country's food needs, increase agricultural production and employment, and increase incomes.

This is due to the changing natural climate, precipitation, irregular precipitation, cold winters and dry summers, which adversely affects the growth of crop yields. Consequently, there is a need to create and implement new research methods for resource-saving technologies in the further development of agriculture in the country.

The webinar was attended by doctoral students and young scientists from TIIAME, the National University of Uzbekistan, Tashkent State Agrarian University and other higher education institutions studying agriculture and water management.
